We appreciate your support, and we are looking forward to working with you in 2019!

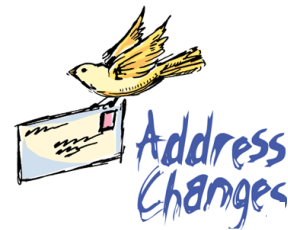

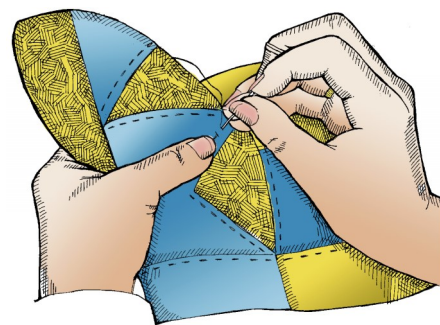


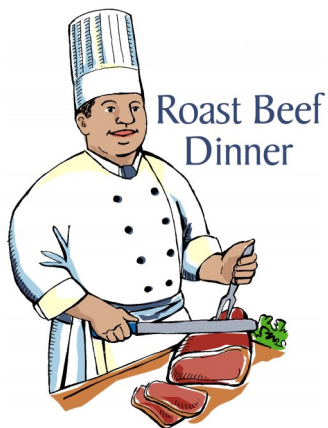
### A REQUEST FROM AUBURN COMFORT BLANKETS

As the colder weather comes into season, it is a good time to get out the sewing machine or the knitting needles and crochet hooks to keep our hands busy. Auburn Comfort Blankets, a group who meets on Tuesday mornings at church, is looking for at-home sewers who could make some children-sized 100% cotton cloth quilts. As a rule, we prefer them to be SMALLER than 40" x 60". Even as small as 36" x 36" are used in the nursery at the hospital. We can supply you with fabric from our stash of donated material. If you are able to make just the quilt tops, we have people who can complete them with batting and a backing. We accept knitted and crocheted blankets as well.

Auburn Comfort Blankets provide blankets to ill or traumatized children. Blankets are delivered to UMass hospitals and to shelters for women and children. This organization is under the umbrella of the Christian Outreach Committee of the church.
