GOSPEL PILGRIMAGE STORYTELLING

Rev. Drew Willard, pastor of Holiday United Church of Christ in Holiday, FL, will be making a road trip and performing “An Evening of Biblical Storytelling” at 16 scheduled stops from Florida to Massachusetts, and we’re excited to be one of those stops! On Thursday, June 28th, Mr. Willard will be with us. We are planning a potluck dinner at 5:30 P.M. followed by his presentation beginning at 7 P.M.

He performs a series of stories selected from the Gospels. *The Prologue* is about the beginnings of Jesus Christ’s ministry with selections from each Gospel. *The Sabbath* is a day in the life of Christ, filled with extraordinary events from Mark 2:23-5:43. *A Love Song to God* includes the turning point of Jesus’ mission, his journey to Jerusalem, and Mary Magdalene as part of the narrative leading up to the Crucifixion and Resurrection. Mr. Willard’s storytelling creates a dynamic portrait of Jesus for his listeners.

Mr. Willard, a Florida resident, has been a minister for 10 years. A West Point graduate, he served as a Signal Corps officer in Europe and Korea, and later served as an assistant to the West Point post chaplain.

He has been a Biblical storyteller for 20 years and is affiliated with the Network of Biblical Storytellers (NOBS). He has presented Biblical stories in a variety of venues including the Drew Theological School in New Jersey; Wesleyan Theological Seminary in Washington, DC; Cornerstone Café in Groton, CT; Outpost in the ‘Burbs Coffeehouse in Montclair, NJ; the Mercy Center in Madison, CT; Greystone Psychiatric Hospital in New Jersey; Ft. Monroe Post Chapel in Virginia; West Point Post Chapel in New York; Blair Academy in New Jersey, as well as churches in Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania.

We feel blessed and privileged to have Mr. Willard with us, and encourage you to join us as we journey back to when Jesus walked the earth!

After the cool, sometimes dismal, spring we've had, are you praying for a long, hot summer? If so, you'll need a good book in hand as you find a shaded, breezy spot in which to read, or to share a book with an elderly person or "little tyke" – supreme relaxation! Here are a few suggestions:

Bryson City Seasons and *Bryson City Tales* (its sequel) by Walt Larimore are both captivating books that will warm your heart with both richly textured miracles and laughter. These books were donated by Gloria Beauregard (Sue Klaucke's mother).

The third book given by Gloria Beauregard is titled, *Whispers Through the Trees* by Susan Plunkett and Krysteen Seeles (sisters) and is a novel that deals with a mystery of nature.

Someone donated an autographed copy of *Not In a Thousand Years* by Geoff Fernald which explains how and why a fascinating and thought-provoking list of "things" evolved.

Among the very large books in the Adult Library is *The Travel Book*, given by Pat Bukoski. It's huge, and heavy, AND IT'S A JOURNEY THROUGH EVERY COUNTRY IN THE WORLD. It's filled with superb info and you can borrow it for 3 months (or more upon request). This "rule" will apply year round and if you borrow it just for its illustrations, you'll be rewarded.

A beautiful and very large Adult Library book is *Giant Book of the Dog*. This is a wonderful exposure for children to the canine world. It's publicized as the biggest and most authoritative work ever produced.

As an adult, older child, or hamster lover, you'll love the interpretation of British history, through some intricate pictures of hamsters and a clever presentation of historical facts, found in *The Hamster's History of Great Britain*. Though not a book with general appeal, Janis Mitchell has put together a bit of unique entertainment.

The Children's Library will be open every Sunday during the summer.

Our goal is not only to satisfy the majority, but to beautify the sanctuary in a way that will breathe new life into our place of worship. Building Use Meeting Thursday, August 23 at 7 P.M.

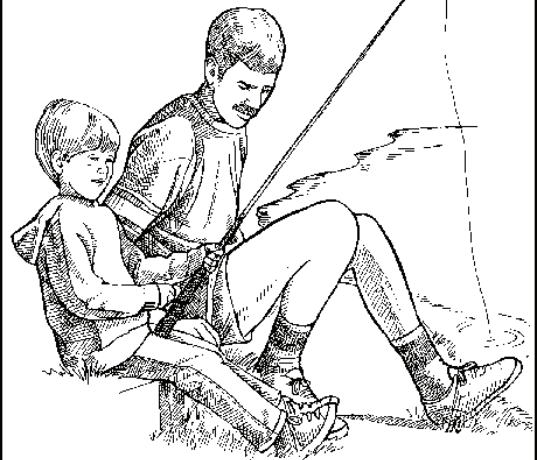
