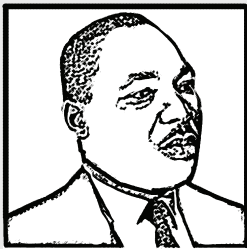

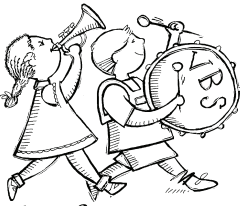
From the Director of Christian Education

Offering envelopes are here - They are in the back of the sanctuary for pick up.

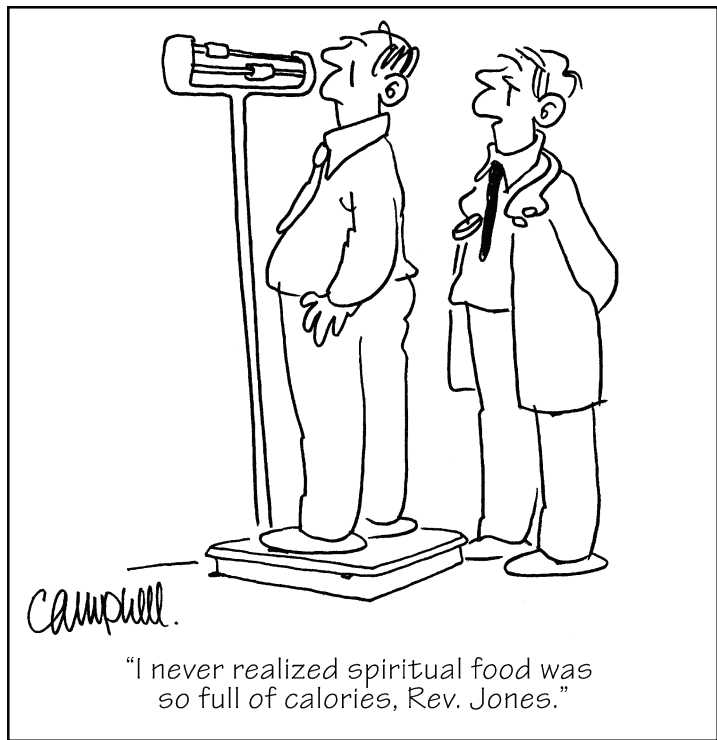
