#### FROM THE PASTOR:

"The Two Wolves"

An old Cherokee is teaching his grandson about life: "A fight is going on inside me," he said to the boy. "It is a terrible fight and it is between two wolves. One is evil—he is anger, envy, sorrow, regret, greed, arrogance, self-pity, guilt, resentment, inferiority, lies, false pride, superiority, and ego."

He continued, "The other is good – he is joy, peace, love, hope, serenity, humility, kindness, benevolence, empathy, generosity, truth, compassion, and faith. The same fight is going on inside you – and inside every other person, too."

The grandson thought about it for a minute and then asked his grandfather: "Which wolf will win?" The old Cherokee simply replied, "The one you feed."

This story was told by Billy Graham in his 1978 book, *The Holy Spirit: Activating God's Power in Your Life.* I think it is appropriate for Lent.

If we are not careful in life, we can find ourselves feeding the wrong wolf. The needs of today can overwhelm our long term plans. In those immediate moments we might do what is easy rather than what is right. We might be stressed at work and yell more at home. Yelling at home is less likely to get you fired, after all, than yelling at the boss.

We have big plans to be good people. We want to be generous, compassionate, patient, but temptation can get in the way.

So, we have Lent, when we take 40 days (not counting Sundays) to prepare for Jesus' resurrection. Let us, during this time, feed the bright wolf and starve the dark wolf. Let prayer have a greater role in our life. Let us do the things we put off until, "a better time." Let now be the better time.

Let us acknowledge when we feed the dark wolf and resolve to feed it less.

I look forward to seeing your well fed, cute, and friendly wolf during Lent.

On April 19th, April 26th, May 3rd, and May 10th rehearsals will be held at 2:30 p.m.


On Music Appreciation Sunday, May 17th, rehearsal will be held at 9 a.m.
