2025 ANNUAL CHURCH YARD SALE

What a blessed Easter season we celebrated this year. I felt as if the blooms showed up exactly on "Resurrection Day!" Karen Ludington, Executive Director for WAMS was our guest speaker at the annual Palm Sunday breakfast and really opened our eyes to what their role in the Worcester area is. We as a committee hope to someday take a "field trip" to their headquarters to learn more of what they do and how we may be of help.
