Here We Grow Preschool

We made it through the first month of a new year, I hope the next month isn't as cold as the last one.

Here We Grow will be conducting a "Calendar Giveaway" again this year. The sale part of this fundraiser will run the month of February. The give-away part will be done each day in March. We start accepting children when they are 2 years, nine months and, for most, it is all about learning to be with other children away from Mom and Dad, and learning to take direction from other people. We have a few class options for our 4-year-old children which focus on getting ready for kindergarten. We are also fortunate to be able to offer a young 4's class. This class is a blend of what the 3-year-old and 4-year-old classes do. It is designed for those children who need an extra year of preschool due to not making the kindergarten cutoff in their town.
