## Free Church

The Mayflower Compact and Congregational New England town meetings are the base for American democracy. Town meetings were held in the meeting house which was also the Sunday worship space. This was back when the Congregational Church was the established church in New England.

Established church means you have to be a member of that particular Church group to be a voting citizen. So Quakers, Baptists, or Unitarians were not allowed to vote in New England while Congregational Churches were the established churches. In those days annual town meetings and church meetings were how the government did its business.

Our annual church meeting is a surviving part of that tradition of democracy. I hope you can join us after worship on January 19 for our congregational meeting.

A couple of years ago I wrote:

“Well a new year ends as a new year begins. We had another election ‘The most important in our lifetime.’ I am sure in 2118 many movies will be made about the historic 2018 midterm election. (That is sarcasm. No, I don’t believe even one movie will be made about this election.)”

I think the same thing will happen in 2020. Nothing truly historic will happen. Are there events you think will be historic? I know what the news will say is historic, and I think they are wrong.

Impeachment? Not the Impeachment, it has happened 4 different times before and had little effect on U.S. History. Can you name the other presidents who were impeached or investigated by an impeachment committee? What were the consequences of those impeachments? If you do not know, then they probably were not historic.

The election? I think we will have an election like the last several. Either a Republican or a Democrat will win the White House. But a president can’t get much done without the Congress.

The Democrats will gain or lose a few seats in the House and Senate and the Republicans will gain or lose a few seats in the House or Senate. Neither party will have enough votes to override a Senate filibuster. Without a large majority in the Senate, few bills passed by the house will become law. National politics will be just like it has been for 20+ years.

I think the most important part of the election is not national. Often who we pick as state and local leaders will have a large effect on our lives. Local inspectors, and the ordinances they enforce, have bothered me much more than anything passed in Washington.

I hope you can take time to get involved in local politics. What do you think our town needs? What is it that our commonwealth needs to focus on?

## **Happy New Year!**




Please remember the medical equipment in the closet. The closet is quite full, but items come and go, so feel free to check.
