So, are you complaining about the heat yet? I know you promised in the middle of February to never complain about the heat and sun again. Did you keep that promise? I know I didn't. We had a couple hot days in May and without my AC in the room my place got very hot; my indoor thermometer read over 90°F. For a moment I thought a little snow or better, rain, would be nice right now. So are you with me?

One of my favorite scenes in *Private Ryan* is the complaining scene. Tom Hanks, as the captain in command, is talking to the corporal who is always complaining and getting on everyone's nerves. So the corporal asks, "What about you, captain, don't you ever gripe at all?"

Tom Hanks says, "I don't gripe to you, corporal. I am a captain. There is a chain of command. Gripes go up, not down. I don't gripe to you or around you. I gripe to my superior officers."

The corporal convinces Tom Hanks' character to do a little role play and the captain proceeds to lay down a world class gripe. Griping was such a huge part of my time in the army. Privates griped about everything. *Everything.* If our cooks were all Wolfgang Puck, the privates would still have complained about the food.

The sergeants complained about the incompetence of the lieutenants and captains, and the ignorance and laziness of the privates. Officers, likewise, complained of conniving sergeants and incompetent majors and colonels.

Griping was the one thing we all could do wherever we were, whatever we were doing. It was our security blanket and God-given right. God-given. God-given!

God is ultimately at the top of all chains of command. So he hears all the gripes, all the complaints, all the petitions. How many gripes do you think God hears a day in prayer? How many thank-yous does he hear a day in prayer?

Is it important that we mix some thank-yous in with our complaints? I believe so. I think we see too clearly what we lack and do not number or see our blessings as easily.

So remember, gripes go up the chain of command. May we pray to the father of the universe, may he hear our prayer and answer it. May we also remember to "Count our blessings, count them one by one. Count our blessings see what God has done."

Central Association Meeting

The Central Association met on Sunday, May 3, at the First Congregational Church in Sutton. The business meeting was only 30 minutes during which we elected a slate of officers and committee members.

The budget was also approved including an increase from \$18,000 to \$20,000. Most of that increase was to cover psychological testing for people in the process toward ordination. The Association had 13 people in the discernment process toward ordination. Five people were approved for ordination in the past year.

After the brief meeting there was a time for workshops. I went to the Worcester Area Mission Society (WAMS) workshop. WAMS is working on two big projects. One is youth involvement and the other is homeless families. These projects are separate because few organizations working with homeless families have places for youth involvement as background checks are now required to work with children. WAMS does host a CityReach type activity called "Reach Out Worcester" which is an overnight homeless experience and mission project.

During the WAMS discussion "Hope for Housing" cards were discussed. Big Y, Shaw's, Stop & Shop, and CVS stores participate in the card program. We buy the cards at face value while the stores sell cards at a 5% discount. That 5% discount is how "Hope for Housing" cards makes money to help the homeless. We participated for awhile in this program, but there were not many stores in Auburn that accepted the cards, so we sold few cards. The program is trying to expand the number of stores that take the cards. Currently the "Hope for Housing" cards are keeping 80 families housed.

After the workshop was worship and a meal. Thus ended the Association Meeting.
