### ROOF UPDATE

We are still in the process of obtaining bids for replacing the entire roof over the sanctuary. Since the current roof has two layers of shingles, the job will involve stripping the old shingles off first. While we haven't received final bids for the entire roof, based on other churches in the area, we believe the cost for our church will fall in the range of \$50,000 to \$60,000. We hope to have more details in the near future. Meanwhile, please keep in mind the Summer Solstice celebration planned for June 18<sup>th</sup>. All proceeds from this wonderful event will go towards the roof fund.

<u>Youth on a Mission</u> has found itself in a rather unusual position with regards to our mission trip this summer to Wheeling, West Virginia. Due to some unforeseen circumstances we have two openings, for which we have already sent deposits.

These two slots would be open to any high school youth, male or female, who has completed confirmation class and is a member of First Congregational Church of Auburn. The interested individual would be responsible for the program fee of \$275. YM would cover costs for transportation etc. This is a **FANTASTIC**, *once in a lifetime* opportunity, for any young person who's thought about participating in YM but hasn't yet made the commitment or who has participated in the past and wants to come back. We leave **very** early on Saturday July 16th and will return on Sunday July 24th. Please see Jennifer Bohn for details or call her at 508-832-0428.

**Youth Camping** - The Bohn's will be taking any youth that has completed 6th grade and up on the family camping weekend in June. The dates are June 24th to 26th they have already reserved one spot and have a pop up camper that sleeps 6. We will rent another site and put up a tent if there is enough interest. The cost for the weekend is \$10 and must be paid up front to reserve your spot. They need to know ASAP if there is any interest in order to reserve space and plan for food and activities. **Youth are welcome to bring a friend**. They do not have to attend First Congregational Church. There is also talk of going to Six Flags New England with the Sutton group. We will let you know when we have a specific date.

### **Interfaith Hospitality Network**

Interfaith Hospitality Network is an organization that unites the religious community in an effort to serve and nurture homeless families regardless of income and family structure. Thirty-one congregations, many with assistance from additional congregations - ours being St. Thomas - provide meals, shelter, and hospitality. Families receive individualized advocacy for housing employment, and financial issues at the IHN day center. The need for IHN is enormous. Rents in Massachusetts are the most expensive in the country and over 20,000 children live in emergency shelter here each year. The formation of IHN was in 1997 and our church has participated every year.

A typical day in the Network at our church:

6 AM - The day begins with a light breakfast.

Let mutual love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it.

Hebrews 13:1-2

7 AM - The van picks up all guests and drops them at the day center for showers. Our overnight hosts lock up the church and leave for their day.

5 PM - The van leaves from the day center and arrives at our church for a dinner prepared by our volunteers for that evening. The families will help before, during and for clean-up. They will make a lunch for the next day if they would like.

6:30 - 8:30 PM - Playtime, homework or other activities or quiet visiting time. Children are put to bed. All lights are out and TV off by 11 PM.

Those from our church who are staying overnight retire to their room and wake to be sure all families are up and will be ready for the van at 7 AM the next morning.

Taking part in our week of Interfaith is a very rewarding experience for all those invited.

Our thanks to *Here We Grow!* When they completed covering the pipes in the ceiling downstairs they included those in the Children's Library. Also, thanks to those teachers and parents who are promoting reading and borrowing books from the Children's Library.

There are some great new books in the Adult Library. <u>Island of the First Light</u> is our second book written by Norman Gatreau. The first, <u>Sea Room</u> is quite new and has been well received. Again, <u>Island of the First Light</u> is centered in Maine and it views a bit of Passamaquody history. It deals with human nature and the sense of family that we seek when faced with adversity.

<u>Garlic and Sapphires</u> by Ruth Reichl is on the current best seller list and is great for insights and laughs. The author, as the food critic for the New York Times, dons a variety of disguises to outwit the restaurants that have her picture in their kitchens and offer cash bonuses to staff that identify her. How else can this connoisseur of fine dining make the truth known?

<u>Wedding of the Waters</u> by Peter L. Bernstein is a riveting story of the building of the Erie Canal. Thomas Jefferson thought the project to be "little short of madness" and others thought it as ridiculous as going to the moon.

Some parishioners have their own copies of <u>The Purpose Driven Life</u> by Rick Warren and now it's available to you in the Adult Library. The author is the founder of Saddleback Church to which Pastor Ken has made reference in several sermons. It is also the book from which the woman, who was being held hostage, read to her captor

and thereby made national news when he surrendered to authorities. The book theme - "What on earth am I here for?"

May God watch over you as you share His season of relaxation and restoration and recognize His blessings.
