FROM THE PASTOR:

As we enter March, it is time for Lent. Lent is the 40 days (not counting Sundays) that precedes Easter. It is a traditional time to prepare for Jesus' death and resurrection.

Over the years, Christians have prepared in many ways. They have followed special diets, most popularly meatless Fridays. They have gone on pilgrimages, and added prayer to their daily routine.

So what are you going to do to prepare for Easter? May I suggest visiting people? As I write this, the Covid restrictions are being eased. It seems Covid will be with us for years to come but, hopefully, the worst of the disease is behind us.

Many people have suffered with depression and anxiety. I know I have. I am unsure if I will ever feel comfortable in a full baseball stadium or a big gymnasium for a basketball game again, but that does not mean I will stop going to ball games. I will just take precautions that I never thought of before 2020.

Going to games is fun, and we should be careful to not be isolated. Isolation and loneliness, we know, are killers. It is used to torture prisoners, drive them insane. A lonely senior is likely to suffer worse dementia than a more social person. But even knowing that, I had worries when I went to my clergy group. I have known these pastors for 10 years, yet seeing them in person again made me nervous. Was I right to be nervous or was it overreacting? That is a decision we all make for ourselves and our families.

Our kids, especially, have been brave. Though the virus seems to not make kids extremely sick, they have had to do Zoom school and wear masks almost everywhere they go. They did this to help slow the spread to older people. People for whom Covid was a life and death worry.

I think now is the time to let kids be free of those restrictions. Set them free to run and yell with friends once more. Let kids make new friends. Childhood was a great time for me to make friends.

> "Want to play tag?" I'd ask. "Yes!" a new kid would say.

And just like that, I had a new friend.

I fear this epidemic has made all of us less willing to approach strangers. Fear of Covid has reinforced our fear of new people. That is sad.

May God help us make new friends and strengthen old friendships.
