The books tell us Lent is a time to slow down. Experience tells me that everything speeds up at this time of the year, even without Lent. My lawn guy wants to know if I want him to come and clear the winter's yield of branches off the grass. My heavy coat stares at me from the rack and wants to know if it isn't time to put it away and bring out the lighter weight clothing. The upholstery on the couch needs to be cleaned. . .

And Denise is – ever so gently – asking me to get this finished so she can get the newsletter out.

There's nothing like a rush like this to bring me up sharp and remind me that the idea of Lent as a time to think, to do less, is just as important as it is difficult. God did not make us to rush around non-stop now and always. Lent reminds us that, even if we can't do it for long, even if all we can manage is five quiet minutes in the car before we start it up and take off for the next thing... we need to take the time to do that.

We need to give ourselves time and space to let our brain coast, even if it is only for a few minutes. In Lent, we have the opportunity to read our devotional and let those thoughts live in our hearts for the day, bringing us a change of pace.

And thank God for people like Denise, who, when I was overwhelmed last week, gave me space – and at the same time, made sure I got this done!


Maundy Thursday Service will be held March 28th at 7 p.m.

FROM THE DIRECTOR OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

I hope this message finds everyone in good health and good spirits during this season of Lent. How are you doing with your personal Lent commitments? Did you give something up? Did you add more time with your Bible or connecting to Jesus? Or, did you commit to helping those in need? More than any of these traditions, my hope and prayer for you is that you have taken a moment (or a few) to reflect on this past year. Acknowledge the mistakes you have made and ask forgiveness. On March 31st of this year, we will all be celebrating the resurrection of Jesus and forgiveness of sins. While today we may feel burdened, soon we will delight in freedom.

As we continue to go through the season of Lent, I am reminded of my experience last year at the Easter service in my hometown, Calvary Lutheran Church, lead by Reverend Zachary Dean. His children's sermon was inspired by Bob Marley's famous song, "Three Little Birds." I am honored to have this opportunity to share and hopefully inspire you as well.

"Three Little Birds" is a very simple song, in terms of its lyrics. "Don't worry about a thing" is repeated approximately 10 times. That line is followed by "cause every little thing is gonna be alright." These verses are sung by three little birds, perched outside the window. The author describes the sound of the songbirds as "pure and true." He continues to say that their message is for "You-u-u." What if.... The three birds represent the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit? The Holy Trinity of God, Jesus and the Spirit? The song they sing together makes them one entity. The message they are singing is to stop worrying!! It will all be ok!! The Bible tells us 365 times to not be afraid or do not fear. Are we receiving this message? I will leave you with a few Bible verses below to read at your own leisure, that state the second part of this chorus. God tells us, it is going to be not just ok, but good!

We have reviewed the meaning of Lent in all classes up to this point. In my older classes, our focus has been on the Ash Wednesday phrase of "from dust we were made, to dust we shall return" (as stated in Genesis). The Bible connects us all, not only to each other, but also to the earth. Humans from all walks of life are connected through God and connected to the earth, despite the differences our society wants us to focus on. (Genesis 2:7) God took the earth and breathed life into it. Over the next few weeks leading up to Easter, we will be studying the life of Jesus.

Thank you to all the parents and guardians that bring your child to church on Sundays and Tuesday nights. As a mother myself, I understand that life gets us crazy. I see you making the effort to be here.

Thank you to the BOCE for always supporting the needs of our youth programs.

Thank you to Lilly, Michele and Michael for showing up consistently to make a difference in the life of a child. Thank you to our entire congregation for always showing your love and support to me and all things involving our youth!

May the Lord light up the path on your journey. May you rest in the knowledge that . . . "Every little thing is gonna be alright!"

Windsor H. "Win" Bigelow, Jr, of Charlton (formerly of Webster, Auburn and Worcester), MA, passed away February 2, 2024, at the age of 93. He was born in Worcester to the late Windsor H. Bigelow, Sr.

and Ethel (Nelson) Bigelow. Mr. Bigelow was predeceased by his first wife of 43 years, and mother of his three children, Nancy (Smith) Bigelow, his sister Dorothy, wife of Nelson B. Craver, and his stepdaughter Daryl (Kilgore) Cahill.

Mr. Bigelow is survived by his present wife of 25 years, Jacquelyn (Kilgore) Bigelow; two sons and their wives – Windsor "Skip", III and Paula; Scott and Nancy; and a daughter Susan "Sue", and her husband Dave White; a stepson Joshua Kilgore, as well as several grandchildren, great-grandchildren, nieces and nephews. He very much enjoyed his earlier years boating and sailing with his entire family most of his life while summering and finally living on Lake Chargoggagoggmanchauggagoggchaubunagungamaugg in Webster, prior to moving to Charlton.

Mr. Bigelow attended schools in Worcester and graduated from Worcester Academy and Tufts University in Medford. He was a principal of Bigelow Electrical Co., Inc. and Warren and Bigelow Electric Co., Inc. of Worcester for decades prior to retirement. Mr. Bigelow served in the United States Navy during the Korean Conflict, and finally attained the rank of Lieutenant Commander, prior to retiring from the Navy. He was a member of our Church and very active on the troop committee of Troop 101, Boy Scouts of America. Mr. Bigelow was a member of the Legion of Honor, a holder of the degree of Chevalier, and a Past Master Councilor of Worcester Chapter, Order of DeMolay in Massachusetts. He was a 33rd degree Scottish Rite Mason and recipient of the Meritorious Service Award, a member of the Valley of Worcester Scottish Rite and Past Thrice Potent Master of Worcester Lodge of Perfection, a member of the Massachusetts Consistory, and a member of Aleppo Shrine AAONMS. Mr. Bigelow was also a recipient of the Joseph Warren Meritorious Service Medal, a member of Rose of Sharon Lodge, AF&AM, a member of Joel H. Prouty Lodge AF&AM, and a member of Morning Star Lodge, AF&AM.

A memorial service was held here at the church on Saturday, February 24th. Burial will be at the convenience of the family in Hope Cemetery, Worcester.
