From the Pastor

As we come into October, we are quite busy at church. We will have Consecration Sunday (October 13), a baptism (October 20), and Memorial Sunday (October 27). On top of that, we have 3 fundraisers: pumpkin patch (starting September 28 and going until Halloween), the fall fair (October 19), plus our community supper (October 26).

I like the fundraisers that get people into our church. Church for many people can be intimidating, even scary. Many people have had bad experiences with churches.

How many good church experiences have you seen in movies or TV recently? Most depictions of the church that I remember show people being negative or abusive. Our culture seems to tell us that church is a place of judgement and even violence. I hope we don't feel that way about our church.

Getting people with no church background into church can be hard. There are a lot of emotions people can have around church. So, as you are encountering people around the fair, the pumpkins, or the dinners, please be pleasant (as I know you all are) and have a little thought in your head of how people might have a lot of emotion and negative experiences around the idea of church.

I have noticed in New England several people have said jokingly that they fear the roof of the church will collapse, or a lightning bolt will strike them, if they come to church. Now this is a joke and an excuse not to come, but I think it also has a ring of truth.

People expect to meet the Holy and Mighty One in church and that can be a scary thing. God in Jesus Christ is very welcoming. He called the little ones to come to Him, even though the disciples tried to stop them.

Modern Christians, who are not welcoming, are like those disciples. But Jesus welcomes the little ones and we are to welcome them as well.

I hope we see lots of new people around church this month. I hope they feel welcome.

Here We Grow Preschool



While we welcome in the beautiful month of October, the staff and most of the children have settled into a nice routine. I am happy to report that almost all of the crying has stopped.

Currently, we have a few openings in the morning and afternoon 3-year-old classes, the 4-year old afternoon class, and the 5-day class. If you know of someone who is looking for a preschool for their child, please have them call the school at 508-832-8184. The highest compliment we can receive is a referral to family and friends. This year we have several children in our classes for whom English is not their first language, which brings a different set of challenges to the teachers, but we are up to the task! We look forward to

watching these children, as well as all our students, gain confidence and grow during the year.

Our first fundraiser is currently happening; this year we are working with Bemis Farm in Spencer to build a scarecrow. This event is open to anyone on Saturdays and Sundays from 9am-3pm through October 14. If you preregister at www.bemis.biz, the cost is \$20 (\$25 if you pay at the door) and you get to build a life-size scarecrow, take a walk through the pumpkin path, plus get a small pumpkin and a mum to bring home. There is a flyer posted on the bulletin board in fellowship hall; this is a great family event!

During the month of September, the children became familiar with their teachers, new friends, and new surroundings. They had a tour of the entire building and met Denise and Pastor Brian.

Each child received homework the second week of school. Continuing with one of our traditions, the children created a picture page of their families and added it to their classroom family album. It is one of the ways we become familiar with the many different types of families attending HWG. It is also a great way for the children to open-up to someone, just by talking about their families.

We had a great parent turnout for Parent Orientation which was held a week before school started. For the 10th year we offered a "Meet the Teachers" time before the actual first day of class. Again, we had a good turnout.

Starting the first day of school all the children are taught our prayer that we say before our snack and lunch times. Many of the children teach their families the same prayer at home. I would like to share the prayer with you and, again, fondly remember Gloria Whitehead who found this prayer for us.



Last year, Outreach focused on our homeless population. We cooked and volunteered at soup kitchens, we took donations of socks and underwear. We represented all of us when Outreach, and often Youth on a Mission, were able to put a smile of relief on the forgotten faces of the homeless community. Unfortunately, we learned very quickly that due to the opioid problem this nation faces, most of the community outreach was specific to adults.

After a long discussion, the Outreach Committee has decided to put a focus on children this year. We have reached out to DCF (Department of Children & Families) to see how we can partner with them. The discussion, as of this *Tidings*, is that it seems adolescent females have the biggest need. We are also reaching out to local middle schools to help young women feel comfortable as their bodies begin to change. Pastor Brian, Cindy Dube, and Shannon Hartmann recently attended a wonderful seminar for Habitat for Humanity at WAMS (Worcester Area Mission Society) in Worcester. We learned about local projects, international projects, and projects for the youth, including playhouses for children of veterans and active members of the military. We are going to partner with this wonderful charity! Stay tuned to see how.

Please continue to keep those who are less fortunate in your prayers. God has blessed us with abundance! Including the love and warmth we all experience when we share our time and our resources with one another! Our church. Our members. Our family!!!! May peace be with you always!!!!
