#### From our Interim Pastor — The Rev. Dr. Virginia Child

When my grandfather was a young man in Woodstock CT, he sold milk, butter and eggs door to door in a horse-drawn wagon. By the time he died, we'd landed a man on the Moon. He grew up in a world that didn't yet have typewriters, and, though he didn't have one, people had begun to have their own computers by his death. The world had changed so quickly and much was turned upside down.

We're in the midst of another fruit-basket upset change in our world today. Except, this time, it's not "things" (horse-drawn-carts to spacecraft) that have changed, but rather expectations and assumptions in our world. And in many ways, today's list of changes is much more disconcerting than improvements in transportation and communication were to my grand-parents.

Our understandings of the people in our world have changed.

Our expectations and opportunities for people have changed.

And our reasons for attending and supporting our local churches have changed as well.

These changes are driving massive changes in our UCC churches. Some of you have already spoken to me about the changes in attendance and participation you've seen here. Fewer people come to church; they find it harder to take up membership. As we look into the future, we're beginning to realize we don't know what's coming next.

Here's what the folks who study churches are saying: more and more, people come to church – when they come – to meet God. They come to find purpose, meaning and value. What they don't come to do is join committees, or volunteer to do things that we're really only doing because they were important to our grandparents. On the other hand, they'll work their fingers to the bone to keep a worthwhile project going.

And here's another thing they'll do. Imagine we come up with a project - re-starting the Food Pantry or giving a new book to every first-grader at the end of the school year – but we're hesitant to jump in because we don't have enough people to do it. If the project meets a community need, folks these days will recruit their friends and family to join the project, even if they'll never join the church. We become the force multiplier – our small group draws in others to share the work.

We are becoming the leaven in our communities, the spirit of God's love and justice which makes a community strong. We will be the cheerleaders, the encouragers, the folks who rally the town around a goal. Instead of thinking our purpose is to maintain the building, or to keep up the organizational structure as it is, we'll shift our focus so that we see our service as the center, and our building, worship time, Bible studies, etc., as resources to help keep us – and our world – on the way.



#### Here We Grow Preschool

We made it through the first month of the school year, the heat and humidity made it tough, but we survived! As we welcome in the beautiful month of October, the staff and children have settled into a nice routine. We are hoping for some nice weather for a few weeks, before the cold starts; being outside is so good for the body and spirit.

The start of a new school year can be stressful for everyone; for many of our new students this is their first time in the care of someone other than family. They are learning to work in a group, follow directions from new adults as well as valuable self-help skills. At this age children should be encouraged to try to do simple tasks for themselves, such as pulling up their pants, throwing away trash, picking up toys. As they start to bring in coats, etc. we will work with them to put on their own coats using the up and over method.

Currently, we have limited openings in some classes. If you know of someone who is looking for a preschool for their child, please have them call the school at 508-832-8184. The highest compliment we can receive is a referral from family and friends.

During the month of September, the children became familiar with their teachers, new friends, and new surroundings.

Our first fundraiser is currently happening; we are once again working with Bemis Farm in Spencer to build a scarecrow. This event is open to anyone on Saturday and Sunday from 9-4 until October 15. You must preregister this year at <a href="www.bemis.biz">www.bemis.biz</a> the cost is \$25/ family, (there will be very limited walk-ins for \$30), and you get to build a life size scarecrow in a pot with a small pumpkin and a mum to bring home; they also have a pumpkin path and mini corn maze. There is a flyer posted on the board in Fellowship Hall; this is a great family event. We will also be having another Papa Gino's fundraiser night on October 24 from 4-9.

For your future planning, we will be doing another Savers clothing drive this year. We will begin collecting soft items (NO PILLOWS), shoes and books, movies, records, etc. on **November 5 and ending on November 17**. Clothing should be in bags, books and other media can be boxed. Items can be left on the stage in fellowship hall or in the Sunday School room next to Shannon's office. We appreciate all your donations; we couldn't do it without your help.

Starting the first day of school, all the children are taught our prayer that we say before our snack and lunch times. Many of the children teach their families the same prayer at home. I would like to share the prayer with you, and, again, fondly remember Gloria Whitehead for finding this prayer for us.

Thank You for the World so sweet. Thank You for the food we eat. Thank You for the birds that sing.


